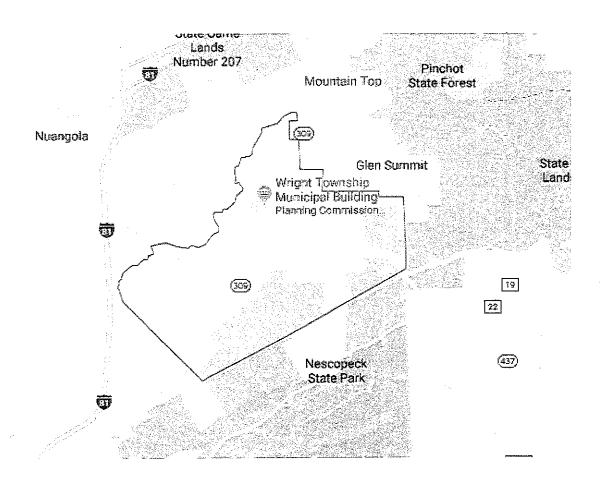

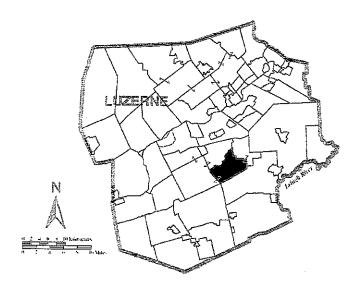

#### Background

Wright Township is located in the mountains of Luzerne County, PA between the cities of Wilkes-Barre and Hazleton. The population is 5,722 as of the 2020 census which is a slight increase over the 2010 census. The township has 27.37 miles of township roads, 13.49 miles of state roads and 8.9 miles of county roads.



Wright Township provides full time police protection and has a department of public works that performs road and stormwater facility maintenance, as well as planning/zoning, recreation, recycling and parks. The Township emergency services are provided by a volunteer fire department and the non-profit Mountaintop Community Ambulance Association for advanced life services and Dorrance Ambulance provided by the Wright Township Volunteer Fireman's Association for basic life services.

The Township has a 35-acre recreation park consisting of playground, basketball and tennis courts, baseball field, sand volleyball court, soccer field and walking trail. A master plan was completed in 2023 for the park and the Township has several park renovation projects planned.

Wright Township is home to the Crestwood Industrial Park and the Crestwood School District High School. The 1,050-acre Crestwood Industrial Park consists of twenty-five manufacturing and warehousing companies and employs approximately 2,150. Also in the Crestwood Industrial Park is compost recycling center (sponsored by the Mountaintop Area Council of Governments). The school district employs approximately 315 and serves 3,021 students drawing from a region of approximately 24,850 people.

#### **Budget Purpose**

The purpose of the Township Board of Supervisor's budget is to provide a financial guideline for the upcoming 2024 calendar year. The annual budget shows how much revenue the township expects to receive, where the revenue will be generated from, and how the revenue will be spent. The budget is also the legal authorization for the Township government to expend money during the budget year for specific purposes. Public budget meetings are held to ensure reasoned and balanced decisions are made on how municipal resources will be spent. Section 3202 of the Township Code requires the Board of Supervisors to prepare and adopt a budget that accurately reflects the estimated revenues and expenses of the township for the upcoming year by December 31st.

The Board of Supervisors are committed to administering the township in the most cost-effective manner possible to meet community needs. The budget is presented on the cash basis of accounting.

#### **Budget Narrative**

The 2024 Wright Township Proposed Budget is respectfully submitted to the Board of Supervisors and residents of Wright Township.

The 2024 General Fund Operating Budget calls for revenues and expenditures of \$2,632,029 as compared to the 2023 budget with revenues and expenditures of \$2,2,215,913 which is an increase of approximately \$416,116 compared to the prior year. \$283k of the difference is related to the fire department tax mileage presentation as compared to the prior year presentation. The fire tax mileage is presented in 2024 as both an income and expense item and nets to \$0 as these funds are given directly to the Fire Department by the tax collector.

#### Income

Property tax difference of \$293k is primarily due to \$283k related to the fire department tax mileage presentation as compared to the prior year. There was a property tax increase of .3 mills for 2023, for a total of .5 mills dedicated to the fire department. This increase was passed after a voter referendum indicated Wright Township residents were in favor of a tax increase for fire mills. Wright Township property tax rate for 2024 will be .8 mills for general purposes and .5 mills dedicated to the fire department for a total 1.3 mill property tax. There is no current year property tax increase.

The additional drivers of change in revenue are an increase of approximately \$8k due to an increase in projected property tax due to additional housing built in the township; an increase in local enabling taxes for a combined total of \$115k due to a projected increase in earned income tax and local service tax; a decrease in projected recycling grant revenue of \$18k due to state reimbursement; an increase recycling program fees of \$4k; an increase in zoning and code fees of \$9.5k; an increase in miscellaneous revenue of \$36k related to projected sale of an asset and additional miscellaneous reimbursements; and \$23k decrease in transfers in from other funds.

Local enabling taxes and property taxes on average makeup 80% of the Township's operating income. Earned income tax is 53% of the Township's income with property taxes contributing 23%. The median household income (in 2021 dollars) from 2017-2021 is \$89,583 with 2,137 households in Wright Township per the 2020 census. At a .5% earned income tax rate, approximately \$1million per year is attributable to personal earned income tax. Earned income tax is at the maximum rate allowable by law. LST (local services tax) which makes up 10% of income is set at \$52 per employee per year which is also the maximum allowed by law.

Property taxes were raised in 2020 by .0484 mills from .7516 to .8000. Prior to that taxes had not been raised for 10 years since 2010 when the mills increase by .2 from .5516 to .7516. The Township has seen limited new home growth prior to 2022. In 2021, two new houses were permitted, in 2022, 15 new houses, and for 2023 year to date 13 new houses were permitted. The township has two approved developments under construction and one proposed development in planning. The Hillcrest development is under construction will have 53 townhouses, most of the permits issued in 2022 and 2023 have been for this project. The Heritage Oaks development is under construction with 48 expected houses. Another development, The Grove is in planning and is projected to have 32 townhomes and 216 apartments in 2024 or 2025. With this development will come increased property taxes and earned income tax as well as increase costs of services for the township. The impact of these developments will be considered in the budgeting process. Additionally, businesses and residents are continuously appealing their property tax assessments which to date has resulted in an offset to new homes built.

Realty transfer taxes since 2020 have fluctuated greatly but have provided an income boost to the Township due to properties in the industrial park beings old. This trend will not continue, and realty transfer taxes will decrease significantly in the upcoming years.

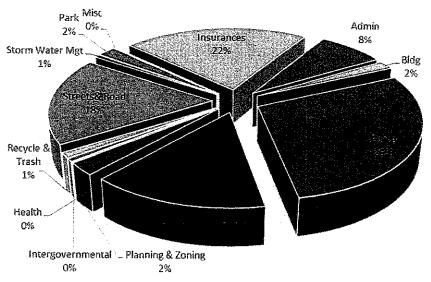

#### Expense

The General Fund Budget expense increased approximately \$416,116 as compared to prior year budget. Property tax expense difference of \$283k is related to the fire department tax mileage presentation as compared to the prior year. Other changes as compared to prior year are: Projected expense increases include employee insurances of \$38k; \$18k increase in MS4 expense; \$17k in infrastructure improvements and salary increase of \$52k. Projected expense decreases include police equipment of \$7k.

Wright Township's budgeted expenses by department are 29% Police, 18% Department of Public Works, and 15% Fire Department. Employee benefits and insurances are not allocated to department and make up 22% of the 2024 budget.

#### **Budget Assumptions**

Level of services to stay the same.

Full time staffing to remain consistent 7 Police, 4 Department of Public Works and 2 Admin. Currently, there is a vacancy in the Department of Public Works.

Capital budget is balanced using fund balance (net assets) from prior years.

Capital expenditures will include road work and vehicle purchase funded by grants and liquid fuel funds.

No debt to be incurred.

#### **Prior Year Accomplishments**

The Township providing the following services and completed the following projects in 2023.

The Township provided 24-hour police service, road maintenance, repair and plowing, curbside leaf pickup, zoning and planning administration, recreational facilities, and on-site recycling. Additionally, Wright Township provided drop off yard waste facilities through the Mountain Top Area COG.

Roads - Projects consisted of paving roads in Fox Run funded by an LSA, paving the municipal park parking lot funded by CDBG funds and a stormwater infrastructure project in Green Mountain estates funded by Luzerne County ARPA funds.

In 2022, the Township spent \$1.3 million dollars on road repair and maintenance as reported on the FHWA 536 report. \$708k was spent on repaving, \$55k on traffic signals, \$222k on snow removal, and \$240k on repair and maintenance of existing roads. These funds were a combination of general, capital and liquid fuel fund expenditures.

Wright Township Department of Public Works did pothole patching and drainage projects throughout in addition to regular maintenance duties.

Ongoing projects include safety improvements to Park Road including a pedestrian/bike lane funded through multi-modal grant.

Police – Body cameras were purchased with grant funds from Pennsylvania Commission on Crime & Delinquency. A project to outfit police with new tasers, car cameras and weapons is ongoing.

Park - The master planning process was undertaken in 2022 and completed in 2023. The master plan process was spearheaded by a committee of residents, business owners and other interested parties. The study included public input as to what upgrades and amenities are desired for the park.

MS-4 - Work continues complying with the unfunded MS-4 storm water mandate. A Pollution Reduction Plan was approved by DEP in 2023 and the Township was issued an individual permit.

ARPA- The Township received approximately \$592k of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding. Funds from the ARPA were allocated to the following projects in 2023: park parking lot match; information technology upgrades; and an accreditation program for the Police department.

COG- The Township received a grant for a new tree branch grinder which will arrive in December 2023.

The Township has several ongoing and newly proposed capital projects for 2024. Capital projects including road work to be performed in 2023 are contingent on successful funding in relation to actual cost. The Township intends to diligently pursue grant opportunities for 2024.

The Township also plans to make safety improvements to Park Road including repaving, ADA and stormwater infrastructure work.

The Township will also continue work on the park with additional improvements to the play area slated; plans include a resurfacing of the upper tennis court deck with ADA improvements and the design of new park bathrooms.

Other projects under consideration include purchase of a police vehicle, purchase of a plow truck, and road paving.
